

Colic: General

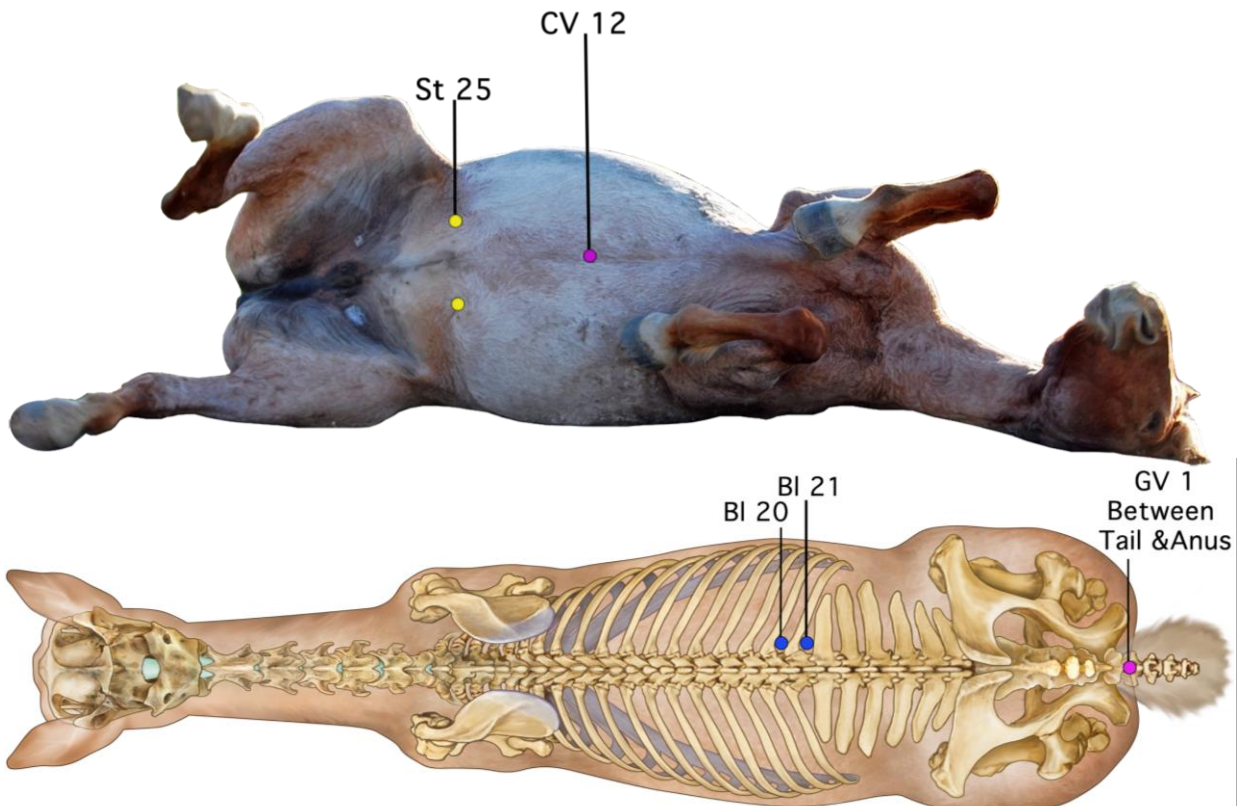
This is a general chart for idiopathic colic that presents mild symptoms or if you have a horse that is prone to colic when certain conditions are present, you can use these in advance to minimize the risk and prevention. Be sure to monitor your horse's vitals-heart rate, mucous membrane color, temperature, respiration rate and gut sounds. Symptoms of colic include, but are not limited to not eating, standing in odd positions, biting or kicking at their belly, lying down, rolling, groaning. These points may be used AFTER veterinarian treatment and the horse is still exhibiting signs of colic and/or discomfort. Please note that strangulating/displacement and intussusception can be deadly if not treated early and by a veterinarian. Enteritis, a bacterial or viral infection in the intestines presents symptoms like colic but requires the underlying cause to be addressed. Light therapy can safely be administered for ANY type of colic without interfering with traditional therapies, including after surgery.

Protocol

RED: Illuminate points (both sides of the body), for 30-60 seconds per point, continuously until resolved. Alternate with green, if available.

BLUE: N/A

GREEN: Same as red



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
